In October, the class was invited to **explore the** possibility of designing and constructing an adaptive bike trail at Oak Grove. Students spent a full day in an **immersive** learning experience in which they explored what it would take to build an adaptive trail.

6th grade teachers set up four learning sessions in the morning, in which students calculated slopes with clinometers to decide what slopes are acceptable for the trail; discussed the kind of experience they hope for the people who visit the adaptive trail; talked about how our terminology can show love for others; and tested adaptive bikes, played basketball in wheelchairs, and played games with sight-reducing goggles, to experience the physical realities of people who will enjoy the trail.

In the afternoon, they welcomed friends from the community who move about in

wheelchairs - asking questions about how they adapt and what the trail would need to be a great outdoor experience for all who use it.

Their **deep hope** through this experience is that, as people who reflect God's image, they are to follow God's call to create ways for all image bearers to enjoy creation.

## Living God's Story: Elements of a Growing Disciple

**"Living God's Story"** is the overall storyline that guides our daily school life. In our chapels and weekly storyline events, we are delving into our eleven **"Elements of a Growing Disciple"** (also called "throughlines" or "discipleship characteristics").

**Each Wednesday at SCCS, we reserve part of our day for worship and fellowship.** The first week of the month is our whole-school Storyline Chapel in the gym. The second week we enjoy a connection group activity, and in the third and fourth weeks we have a time of praise and worship, a storyline-related activity chosen by teachers, or a "Table group" activity.

**Table groups** are a new development this year, created to build a senseof community and belonging that helps our **5th - 8th graders firmly fixtheir identity in Jesus Christ,** who welcomes them to His table. Theyare a mixture of different grade levels and meet once a month.

Last year we focused on half of the elements. This year we will focus on these elements and truths: "Creation Enjoyer" and this truth: "I can discover, enjoy, and celebrate God's creation." "Word Applier" and this truth: "I can apply God's Word in all areas of life." "Image Reflector" and this truth: "I can develop my talents and gifts to reflect God and serve others." "Justice Seeker" and this truth: "I can see injustice and try to respond with love and fairness." "Truth Finder" and this truth: "I can recognize idols in my life and choose to focus on the true God." "God Worshiper" and this truth: "I can worship God in all parts of my life."

Students look forward to our **classroom Storyline connection activities** in which we pair up with different grade levels and work through an activity that helps connect the discipleship element to their hearts and hands.



We enjoy singing songs that connects to the "element", plus two songs that we sing at every chapel and in our classrooms for the whole year are "*Goodness of God*" and "*You Know the Way*".

My passion for the mission and vision of Sioux Center Christian School is as genuine today as it was when I started in 2007. I love this school. The faculty and staff are among the best in the country. The skill and passion they bring to their craft each day is unmatched. Our leadership team is humble, dedicated, and equipped. Our board of trustees is visionary and devoted to excellent Christian education. Deeply committed families spur us on to serve them with persistent care and energy. School supporters generously give of their time, talent, and treasure. The students bring us joy each day.

The deepest desire of my heart is that God continues to lead SCCS to disciple His children by equipping them with a knowledge and understanding of Christ and His creation so that they can obediently serve Him and others as they work and play. That same desire for God's leading in my life has led me to decide that this will be my final academic year at Sioux Center Christian School. My personal storyline is "Courage over Comfort", and God continues to point me toward new opportunities that require courageous action. I desire to fuel new and existing Christian schools in Iowa and nationwide. My passion lies in being a tireless advocate for Christian education and educational choice, and I desire to serve schools through coaching, support, advocacy, and leadership. I firmly believe more students need to be in Christian schools.

I'm grateful I will have opportunities to accomplish such work with the lowa Association of Christian Schools, Dordt University, the Center for the Advancement of Christian Education, and Development & Leadership Coaching. Due to recent events in lowa and nationwide, **I believe I can use my God-given gifts to impact many Christian schools.** I will assist in the start-up of new Christian schools across the state and the continual improvement and strategic planning of current Christian schools nationwide. I will also be teaching graduate-level courses and coaching school leaders. **I am excited for what is next; however, I am going to miss SCCS greatly.** 

I will finish my leadership with SCCS strong, and, although it may feel different, I intend to stay invested in this place for the long term. I'm already mourning the loss that will inevitably come with change. What brings me comfort is that I know the leadership, faculty, and staff here are enthusiastic, talented, and courageous in their service to the Lord. The school is in good hands, God is at work, and He is forever faithful. It is a blessing to report that the state of SCCS is strong. The head of school vacancy will present an attractive opportunity for candidates. My hope in announcing my planned departure now is to give the school plenty of time to find a replacement, and the SCCS board of trustees will soon be sharing more about the search process. I am committed to working with the board, faculty, staff, and supporters in the coming months to ensure a smooth transition, which will take place July 1, 2024. Alicia and I will remain in Sioux Center.

Please pray for Alicia and me as we take steps forward together. Our prayers will be for the SCCS community as well. It has been an honor to serve with so many who collectively believe God's children should be Treasured, Trained, and Transformed for His glory. I will always be a Trailblazer!

### IGNITE the VISION for God's kids at SCCS: Update on the Blazer Center plans

By the last week of August, our **kitchen renovation project was completed**! This was the first phase of the Blazer Center plans, which was done to bring our kitchen "to code" and streamline the preparation and serving meals to our growing student body.

For the remaining steps in our plans, our board of trustees and school leadership have been actively engaging in **reality-based planning** to accomplish our original objective of **building transforming, meaningful spaces for a growing and flourishing school**.

Through this planning process, they made decisions that **prioritized our multipurpose performance, athletic, and gathering space, and six middle school classrooms.** Additionally, a **"value engineered" design/build process** allowed coordination between our trusted local contractors and designers to propose more financially efficient solutions. The decision was made to save the new 3rd grade classrooms and some team rooms for the next step in our plans.

The strength of support received throughout the process and the giving level we are at (\$8.1M) helped our board of trustees make the important decision to move forward. The construction bid was awarded to Hoogendoorn Construction for \$13.7 million, which is \$1 million below our original estimate! If we had continued with the original plans (designed in 2019), the cost would have put us well over the Societyapproved \$14.7M. With hopeful anticipation, we look toward a project start date of March 25, 2024, and pray you will consider helping us reach our \$9 million milestone by that date!
