



ABOUT CLOVER KIDS:

Clover Kids is a once-a-month after-school program for first through third graders.

Provided by Iowa State University Extension and Outreach, Clover Kids is a fun, hands-on, STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) focused program that introduces youth to a variety of 4-H concepts and project areas.

Participants will explore healthy living, the environment, social skills, plants and animals, computer skills, science and technology, personality development and expressive arts.

Youth explore the world through a do-reflect-apply experiential education approach that encourages cooperation, creativity and fun while learning.

The primary goal of the Clover Kids program is to promote children's healthy development — mentally, physically, socially and emotionally.

Clover Kids will be offered once a month, October 2019 through May 2020, immediately after school. Clover Kid groups are limited to the first 25 youth registered per location.

All Clover Kids programs start at 3:30 p.m. and end at 5:00 p.m.
