
Living God's Story: Elements of a Growing Disciple

"Living God's Story" is the overall storyline that guides our daily school life. For the next two years in our chapels and weekly storyline events, we will be delving into our eleven "Elements of a Growing Disciple" (also called "throughlines" or "discipleship characteristics").

Each Wednesday at SCCS, we reserve part of our day for worship and fellowship. The first week of the month is our whole-school Storyline Chapel in the gym. The second week we enjoy a connection group activity, and in the third and fourth weeks we have a time of praise and worship and a storyline-related activity chosen by teachers.

In September, we focused on being a "God Worshiper" and the truth that "I can worship God in all parts of my life." Rev. Bob Pollema from Faith CRC helped us dig into what this means.

In October, our focus was on being a "Community Builder" and the truth that "I can understand and build community." Rev. Joel Kok from Covenant CRC explored this element with us and our Drama Ministries Team acted out the Bible text of Genesis 18, where God declares that Abraham has been called and blessed so that all nations will be blessed through him.



Our November element is "Order Discoverer" and we are focusing on the truth "I can see and rejoice in God's fingerprints throughout all of creation." Dr. Val Zonnefeld from Dordt University led us in discovering how the order of mathematics can help us create and praise God. Our Drama Ministries team acted out verses from Genesis 1 and Job.

Students look forward to our **classroom Storyline connection activities** in which we pair up with different grade levels! We worshiped God by "praying in color" together, learned to listen and build community with a LEGO activity, and made tessellations (2D never-ending patterns) that illustrate how God's amazing order creates beauty.

We enjoy singing a song each month that connects to the "element", plus two songs that we sing at every chapel and in our classrooms for the whole year are "Christ Our Hope In Life And Death" and "Jesus, Strong and Kind" (plus we are learning the sign language that goes with this song!). Drama Ministries Club

The Drama Ministries Club is a new after-school opportunity open to 5th-8th grade students. The purpose of the club is to **work together to bring Scripture to life for all our students through dramatized performances in our Storyline chapels** each month. Board of Trustees Report

What has the Sioux Center Christian School board of trustees been up to? This group of leaders continues to meet monthly, with a focus on the future of SCCS. Current topics include finalizing the 23-24 budget process and finishing the next strategic plan. The board also is focused on making several decisions regarding the building project and school choice.

Two times a year, **our trustees visit school during the school day** to see the building in action. On November 21, Mr. Brandon Haan (principal) and Dr. Josh Bowar (head of school) hosted the trustees around the building so they could visit various rooms and spaces. Faculty and staff members were encouraged to carry on as normal that day. The trustees were not evaluating, but rather, they were **observing to see the great work that happens in our building.**

The board continues to work through the process of writing a **new five-year strategic plan.** The strategic plan team has come up with the overall goals for the school, which have been approved by the board, and now directors are working on writing specific action steps to carry out those goals. **Those who are most directly involved in the work are being charged with writing the action steps - something pretty important.** After directors and their teams have had time to work through writing the action steps, there will be an opportunity for faculty and staff to provide feedback. **The board is excited to see where God will take this process!**

At the end of this school year, **Dennis Vander Plaats and Michael De Boer will be completing their service on the board. Thank you, Dennis and Michael, for your commitment!** This means that the board is seeking to find 2 nominees to replace Dennis and Michael. All members of the SCCS Society are **invited to submit names for potential nominees** for the board.

Requirements for Society membership include:

- Personally confesses Jesus Christ as the only Savior and Lord and regularly attends a local Christian church that adheres to all articles of the Apostles, Nicene, and Athanasian Creeds
- Affirms the school's statement of faith
- Are at least 18 years old
- Have school-aged children attend Sioux Center Christian School, if applicable
- Have a passion for providing a Christian education for the children and young people of this community
- Agree to support and promote the mission of the school and pledge not to seek changes in Articles I, III, or IV of the bylaws (mission of the school, purpose of the school, and non-negotiable founding principles)

If you meet all requirements listed for Society membership, you are **encouraged to submit trustee nominations** using the online form (link is on the home page of siouxcenterchristian.com). The **deadline is November 30**.

Results of our Annual Survey

Each year we survey our parents, faculty, and staff to **gather feedback and watch trends** that help our board and administration make decisions. **We are excited to share our annual survey results!** Highlights of the results include:

- Most ratings have improved (many dramatically) since the survey was first given in 2018
- The faculty/staff net promoter score is 98 (out of a possible 100)

 The Net Promoter Score indicates the response to the question: How likely is it that you would recommend our school to a friend, neighbor, fellow church member, family member, or co-worker? (rated 0-10)



- The average of all faculty/staff and parent ratings is near or above 3.50 (4.0 is the highest possible)
- Top 3 ratings from faculty/staff:
 - "Our school's vision is definitely Christian. The school takes seriously its calling to be Christian."
 - "Our school's administrators are leading the employees to provide students with a high quality, Christian education."
 - "The teachers have a good knowledge of their subject areas and how to teach well."
 - Most significant increases in faculty/staff ratings when compared to results five years ago:
 - "Our teachers do a great job of engaging students in their learning."
 - "Our school's employees model Christ in all interactions."
 - "Our school is able to provide employees with the tools they need to do an excellent job."
 - "I believe our school is operated as well as possible financially."
- The parent net promoter score has increased 8 points since 2019 (from 77 points in 2019 to 85 out of a possible 100 points in 2022. According to Charter Oak Research, the average Christian school has a score of 55-60)
- On a scale of 0-10, with 10 being the highest, SCCS parents say they are satisfied, on average, at a 9.10 level
- Top 3 ratings from parents (4 statements included because of score ties):
 - "Our school's vision is definitely Christian. The school takes seriously its calling to be Christian."
 - "Our school provides our students with a clean and safe environment."
 - "Our teachers do a great job of engaging students in their learning."
 - "The teachers have a good knowledge of their subject areas and how to teach well."
- Most significant increases in parent ratings when compared to results five years ago:
 - "The teachers have a good knowledge of their subject areas and how to teach well."
 - "The service opportunities provided by our school help our students learn to be like Christ."
 - "Our employees use technology well."
 - "Our school uses multiple ways to test for what and how our students are learning."

The school leadership team has analyzed the results, and the following action steps are being put in place:

Continue to analyze school communication methods and frequency

Continue providing professional development opportunities to all faculty and staff

Explore adding a learning center teacher to support student needs

Explore providing an extra entrée serving for lunch to students in grades 7-8

SCCS Legacy Plan Report

The SCCS Legacy Plan is the means by which churches financially support their SCCS students and the daily mission of Sioux Center Christian School.

The total Legacy Commitments for 2022-23 from 16 churches is \$1,245,620 (over \$100,000 more than last year). We are 30% of the way through our fiscal year, and we are **blessed to report that Legacy giving is at 38.3% with \$477,072** given since August 1, 2022!

Our vision is to treasure and train God's children so they may be transformed and equipped as the next generation of servant-leaders and restoration workers, obediently living their unique role in God's Story with the passion to share His Story and defend His Truth, now and for their entire lives.

As part of the next step in our vision, we have plans to expand our campus with the addition of a multi-purpose performance, athletic, and gathering space, called the Blazer Center, outfitted to house chapels, plays, concerts, athletic events, and more. Also in the approved building plans are ten new classrooms, several flexible gathering spaces for student learning and teacher collaboration, and a kitchen remodel.

We are excited to share that we have already **received \$5.8 million in funds and commitments to the Blazer Center campus expansion** project! Dr. Josh Bowar (head of school) and Mr. Paul Ross (director of development) continue to connect with supporters and we are **beyond grateful for the many who have joined in leading the way and committing to this step** in the vision for Sioux Center Christian School! The total estimated cost is \$14.7 million, and the board has put in place a **giving-driven construction timeline** with the milestone of \$9 million committed or raised before we bid and break ground.

We know this is a God-sized step in our plans and we trust that He will provide through His people, in His time.


