#### FROM Dr. B.

Greetings, SCCS supporters! Thank you for reading more about SCCS and getting updated on the amazing things God is doing through our school. Thanks for caring about SCCS.

We are off to a great start at school, and our focus remains on staying committed to our Reformed Christian perspective, staying committed to our deeply held beliefs, and staying committed to our biblical mission and vision.

**At SCCS**, we strive to permeate every activity, every lesson, every interaction, every part of the school experience with a biblical perspective. How does that happen? A teacher explaining plants through the lens that God made them unique and for a purpose, a staff member providing correction on the playground through grace and restoration, the choir director highlighting that God made our voices for praise, students planting trees because they are motivated to be creation enjoyers and earth keepers, kindergarten students making maps of SCCS for incoming students to help them feel welcomed, and so much more.

**It's knowing and then doing. It's practicing. It's living.** Students have basketball practice, they have piano practice, they have play practice.

If they are to truly take to heart their calling of being a disciple of Christ, we have to give them practice actually being a disciple of Christ – right now.

That's what Christian education is all about. Whether you're a first grader or an eighth grader, we want to provide opportunities to practice discipleship so that students have a firm foundation for life.

We're definitely not perfect, but we have a deep desire to keep doing our very best. Each of our employees commit to living, serving, leading, and teaching from a biblical perspective. At SCCS, we use the Teaching for Transformation framework, which focuses on helping students see God's Story and then Live His Story, with special

attention on the concepts of creation, fall, redemption, and restoration.

Why do we do this? We treasure each of our students as being created by God. Because of that, we want to train them in His Way and help them develop habits of knowing, loving, and living His Story. Our focus remains on treasuring and training God's kids so that they may be transformed. We are teaching for transformation.

Part of this training includes students being able to understand and defend their faith. It's always been important to defend the Christian faith, but it seems extra important to be able to do that right now, doesn't it? To better train our students to understand and defend their faith, we've implemented a new Bible curriculum, the Building on the Rock Bible curriculum (for grades K-5) and the Walking in Truth curriculum (for grades 6-8). Vetted by our curriculum team and area pastors, the curriculum builds a framework for living biblically in all areas of life, teaches children how to defend their faith, applies what kids are learning to today's world, is engaging, and provides questions that connect a student's mind and faith. Our teachers ensure that all parts of the curriculum stay true to a biblically Reformed perspective. The Building on the Rock curriculum lays the groundwork of worldview education and helps students understand relationships with the Creator, each other, themselves, and creation. The Walking in Truth curriculum trains students to defend their faith and respond to counterfeit worldviews.

At Sioux Center Christian School, we desire to do as much as we can to train students in the Truth and help them share it with others. We want students to see all of life from a biblically Reformed worldview and give them practice and training to do just that from TK/kindergarten to 8th grade.

YOU join in this training when you pray for us, when you love your children and grandchildren and impart wisdom in your home, when you encourage and lead our kids in your church, and when you give gifts in support of our school. **Together we are working to be obedient to Christ's command to make disciples of all nations, starting with our children.** We praise God for this covenant community that provides for a thriving Christian education!

#### Living God's Story: Our Journey

**Each Wednesday at SCCS, we reserve part of our day for worship and fellowship.** How we spend our time demonstrates what we value. And if we say that we value worship and a focus on God, we need to set aside time for just that. From 1:35-2:00pm on Wednesdays, students have the opportunity to participate in various forms of worship.

This year, our **school Storyline is "Living God's Story: Our Journey",** and each month we will focus on a grade level storyline.

Week 1 of each month: Whole-school Storyline Worship. A grade level shares their storyline and how they live it out each day in their classrooms. Check out the "Stories from the Hallways" for each classroom's storyline. Parents, grandparents, and visitors are welcome to attend

**Week 2 of each month: Connection Groups.** Two homerooms pair up to pray together, sing together, or do other relationship-building activities centered on the storyline focus of the month.

**Week 3 of each month: Grades TK-4 Chapel, Grades 5-8 Teacher Choice:** Grades TK-4 gather in the gym for a time of praise and worship, while students in grades 5-8 participate in activities chosen by their teachers.

**Week 4 of each month: Grades 5-8 Chapel, Grades TK-4 Teacher Choice:** Grades 5-8 gather in the gym for a time of praise and worship, while students in grades TK-4 participate in activities chosen by their teachers.

**Chapel and connections:** two key rhythms that we practice at SCCS, helping us implement our vision of every child treasured and every child trained so that every child may be transformed.

#### SCCS Legacy Plan: An Overview of the 21-22 Changes

The SCCS Legacy Plan is the means by which churches financially support the daily mission of Sioux Center Christian School.

Starting with this current school year, **churches now decide each school year what their total gift to SCCS will be**, based on the amount they want to give in support of each SCCS student who attends their church (up to 36% of tuition). With this new model, churches can set a goal they know they can reach, families are re-energized to help their church raise funds, and Sioux Center Christian can expect to receive 100% of the commitments made. Families in those churches receive a per child "Legacy discount" on their tuition statement at the beginning of the school year.

**Total Legacy Commitments for 2021-22 from fifteen churches: \$1,134,500** Note: The total Legacy gifts received for 2020-21 was \$1,152,195!


#### Mystery at Shady Acres: 7th/8th Grade play

**Save the date** so you can be a part of this mystery-solving drama!




#### 7th & 8th Grade Girls' Volleyball Season

I would like to share with the constituency some of **what I shared at the faculty/staff meeting.** We spent a little bit of time **covering some of the major board decisions** that have been made over the past year. Those decisions included changes to the Legacy Plan, restructuring the tuition grant process, updating sections of the west wing of our building, paying off the building debt (exciting!), adjusting PACE's role to focus solely on encouragement and fellowship, and reviewing and adopting the CSI accreditation plan. As a board, we understand some of these decisions were easier to work through than others, and we are thankful for the support of this community and the passion the constituency has for the mission of SCCS.

I also shared **how we spend our time at board meetings.** We ask trustees to do their homework ahead of time so they come prepared to participate at meetings, and we do a pretty good job of being efficient with our time. We cover the following topics every month:



**Above and Beyond** – Josh and Lisa ask faculty and staff to join us so they can highlight the great work they are doing at SCCs. This is always one of my favorite parts of the meeting!

**Spotlight Reports** – We spend time learning about current or potential new programs at SCCS. A few examples include: Spanish language, Outlet 75, and the counseling/guidance program.

Visionary Work – One of the main goals of the board is to spend 85% of our time on visionary work. Yes, we want/need to know what is happening at school right now, but it is our task to look 5-15 years down the road to keep faithfully fulfilling our mission statement. We just completed our latest strategic plan, and we are partnering with CACE this year to develop a new strategic plan. The constituency will have the opportunity to be involved with that process. During our focus on visionary work, we use many methods of gathering information and invite people to share during board meetings.

**Head of School Report** – Josh gives a detailed report every month of his work, and he has specific measurements and goals for which we hold him accountable. The board also provides regular support and encouragement, as Josh serves as the board's sole employee. I am thankful we have a very strategic and hardworking head of school!

**Board Reports** – The finance, Legacy, nominations, and executive teams all report.

One other item I reported at the meeting is the board has made a strategic decision to shift some of Josh's responsibilities to development, connecting with school supporters, promoting the school in the

**community, and strategic initiatives.** As the head of school, he is uniquely positioned to share the story of what God is doing through SCCS, and the board desires to continue advancing the mission of the school through communication, facility improvements, and strategic planning. We are excited for Josh to carry out our vision through having the time and space to be actively involved in the **important role of head storyteller and chief promoter.** 

Lastly, I would like to say **thank you to the entire SCCS community for your support.** It truly is a blessing and a joy to serve on the board because we know how much this community cares for the mission of SCCS!

This expansion plan is south of our current gym and will include renovations to existing spaces.

Watch for open houses coming in January and February, with a society meeting in March in which our society will vote on the campus improvement. It is an exciting privilege to dream of this next step that will be vital to the educational experience of our students for decades to come!
